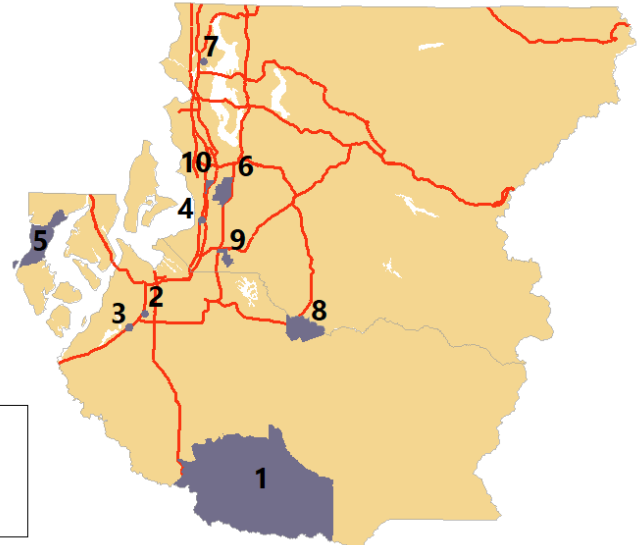
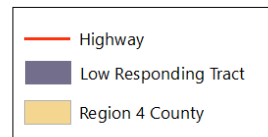
Tracts with Low Self-Response Rates
