

Tracts with Relatively High Percentages of Seasonally Vacant Units *and* Low Response Rates

This table highlights tracts with low self-response rates to date that contain a relatively high percentage (>30%) of seasonally vacant units (e.g., summer homes, second residences, cabins) where many respondents likely have a "usual home elsewhere," targeted outreach may not be effective, and Census Bureau staff will classify many of the seasonally vacant homes during nonresponse follow-up.
